Pilgrims of Hope

Holy Years, or Jubilee Years, are usually held every twenty-five years. However, Pope Francis instigated a special Holy Year of Mercy in 2015; so, having a Holy Year in 2025, brings us back to normal.

Being Pope Francis, he wants us to begin our preparation now! And there will be two parts to our preparation. The first part will emphasise Francis' powerful focus on the fact that we are all children of the Second Vatican Council and that his time as Pope should bring about a deeper understanding of what Vatican II was about and how it should affect our lives. So, he wants us all to go back to the four great documents of the Council and study them over and over. For many people today, the Council is history, but it should be living history. It is said that the effects of any Council take decades to really take hold on the life of the Church. Vatican II was truly radical, about our life in the Trinity and about the way we live that life in the Church, both as individuals and as community in the world in which we live. Many of the ways in which Pope Francis startles us are coming from a deeper understanding of Scripture and of the Teaching of the Church, especially in Vatican II.

So, just to remind us, the four pre-eminent documents of the Council are:

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (Sacrosanctum Concilium)

The Dogmatic Constitution on The Church (Lumen Gentium)

The Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation (Dei Verbum)

The Pastoral Constitution of The Church in the modern World. (Gaudium et Spes)

I include the Latin names, which are the first words of each document, because they are usually, if not very helpfully for most of us, known by these titles. And there will be announcements of helps in looking at them and discussing them. The second part of our preparation, for next year, will focus on private and community prayer and very especially on the Lord's Prayer

So, these are the riches ahead.

Wednesday 1st November – Feast of All Saints

Holy Day of Obligation – Masses; 7am, St. John Fisher, 9.30am, St. Michael, 12 noon, St. Bede and 7pm, St. Basil.

Saturday 4th November – Mass for all the Faithful Departed, St. Bede, 10am.

At this Mass we pray for all who have died, and everyone will be offered a bottle of holy water and a prayer to take to graves or places of remembrance to bless and pray.

Sunday 12th and Sunday 19th November – Masses for all who have died from our parish in the past 12 months, St. Michael's, 4pm.

At these two Masses the names of all who have died in our parish community in the past 12 months will be read aloud, to call them to mind, to pray and to thank God for them.
