Fr. Thomas has been with us for 2 years and his presence amongst us is appreciated by our community. Archbishop + Malcolm has asked Fr. Thomas to concentrate solely on his studies and so on 5th August 2024, Fr. Thomas will leave the parish to go to Ottawa, Canada to continue his studies in Canon Law for two years. We wish him well!

When he returns to the Archdiocese, Fr. Thomas will be given another appointment within the Archdiocese.

So, I, will continue to serve as Parish Priest. We have been promised a new priest to join us in Widnes on 1st September 2024. So, we shall run the parish with two full time priests. This will mean adaptation and an openness to change for us all.
