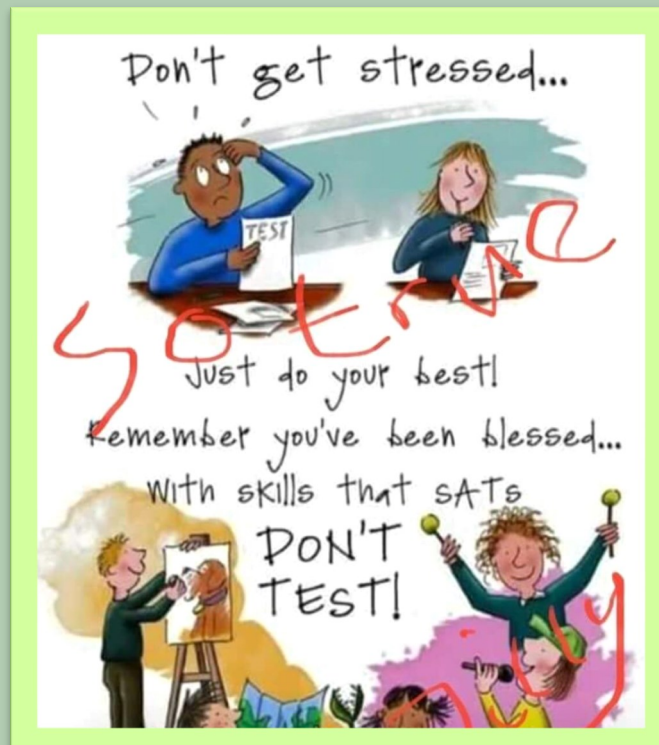

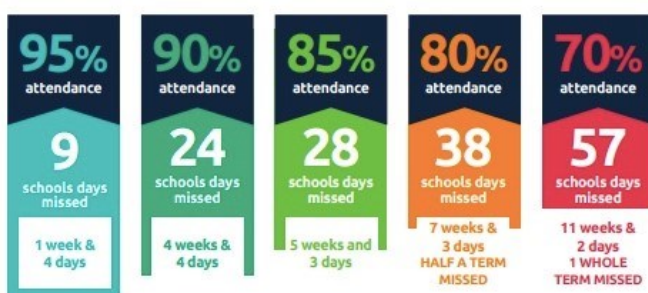
The children were exceptionally well-behaved and enjoyed themselves in the sunshine.

and every minute counts...

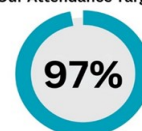


Attendance Ladder
